Boat Landing Dock by Karla DeWitt Doyle

For many years, Association members have expressed the need for a dock at our boat landing. It is very difficult to get boats in and out of our landing because you have to physically get in and out of the water. People with limited mobility need to get help from others, which leaves them at the mercy of time schedules and ability. This year at our annual meeting, it was voted on and approved by the Association to install a dock that is handicap accessible at the boat landing. Here is what has happened since the meeting:

- Mark Stumpf has received quotes from three different companies. All being in the same ballpark of around \$10,000
- Ken Schwebke is working with the State, County, OCLAWA, Lumberjack RC & D, and various other organizations to get grant funding to help pay for the dock.

Due to all of the administrative requirements to apply for grants and other proceeds, we are looking to have the dock installed by Spring, 2023. We will keep everyone informed as things develop further.

Boat Landing Clean Up by Ken Schwebke



On Friday, October 7th, a group of volunteers lead by Ken Schwebke and Tim McGuire tackled a clean-up project at the boat landing. People brought rakes, shovels, chain saws, tractors and dump trailers. EWM Update by Ken Schwebke and Karla Doyle

The following is a report from Eddie Heath, our Onterra Consultant:

EWM 2022 Preliminary Results

The changes we made to the EWM treatment this spring were based on some not so successful results in 2021. The hypothesis that was made based on 2021 results were as follows:

- 1) The application rate of the herbicide may not have been quite right for the areas we were treating.
- 2) The curtains may have shifted due to wind speed leaving gaps where the herbicide may have leaked out during the treatment period.
- 3) There may have been some new species of EWM that is not treated by the herbicide we were using.

This year we changed herbicide treatment levels and added a new variety to address these possibilities.

- We tried the curtain method again in an area on the north side of the lake. I am confident that we used accurate acreage/volume calculations and also assisted with deployment of the curtain through buoy deployment – both factors that ensured we would have the proper dosing. Perhaps you folks have continued to improve at your ability to deploy a "tight" curtain, but I think the attention to accurate dosing parameters was the most important factor in the successful results.
- 2) We used a new herbicide called ProcellaCOR in a non curtain area on the west bay by Stumpf's and Peters. We are initially pleased how ProcellaCOR impacted EWM not only in the application area, but throughout this bay. The extremely dense EWM colonies and deeper water in this area make successful treatment challenging. We did find some remnant EWM during our late-season mapping survey, so we may want to consider a higher application rate in the future.
- 3) Onterra is also having conversations with the manufacturer of ProcellaCOR (SePRO) on treatment timing. On lakes with certain water chemistry parameters, such as higher pH (your lake is on the borderline of our concern for high pH), the treatments may have a narrow time window where efficacy is highest. If we treat too early, the EWM is not actively growing enough to uptake the chemical. If the treatment occurs too late, the lake has a higher pH and the EWM biomass is greater, such that the treatment efficacy reduces. We will continue to look at this topic as we vet ProcellaCOR treatments we monitored in 2022.

Onterra is working up a full report on the 2022 treatment with maps and results. We will send this to everyone once we receive it.

Also, the ALA Board continues to apply for grants and work with Onterra and the DNR to continue to fund this work. Bill Ciske is working on a grant to fund an updated Full Lake Survey to comply with our Lake Management Plan. Karla Doyle is working on a grant to fund further EWM treatment in the spring of 2023. More to come on this in our Spring Archi Times newsletter.

Treasurer's Report by Bill Ciske, Treasurer

During the last five months the Archibald Lake Association (ALA) spending has been primarily focused on aquatic plant management planning and surveying, along with the herbicide treatment of Eurasian Watermilfoil. Over \$17,000 was spent over this period of time to accomplish our goals. Association income continues to keep pace with spending. Membership dues brought in \$6,850.00 and \$2,515.00 was contributed to the Lake Ecology Fund. The picnic raffle was a big success with over \$7,000.00 received in proceeds. The brat fry raised \$298.00 while the Oconto County Lakes and Waterways Association (OCLAWA) contributed \$180.00 from their own raffle. The ALA Board of Directors continues to pursue financial aid in the form of grants from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, Oconto County, and OCLAWA.

Thank you to everyone who has helped us sustain our lake resource and community.

Shoreland Restoration Grant Reminder

OCONTO COUNTY: <u>Cost Share Program</u>: for projects such as shoreline restoration, shoreline buffers, and rain gardens. The County pays 70% of a project, the owner 30% for a maximum of \$2,500. The county has set aside \$20,000 per year for various county-wide cost share practices. Applications are accepted after January 1st of each year until funding runs out. Ken Dolata, the County Land and Water Conservationist will go to your property and give advice and design assistance at no cost. If you do your own planting, you can get reimbursed \$12.00 per hour for your time.
